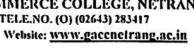

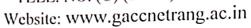

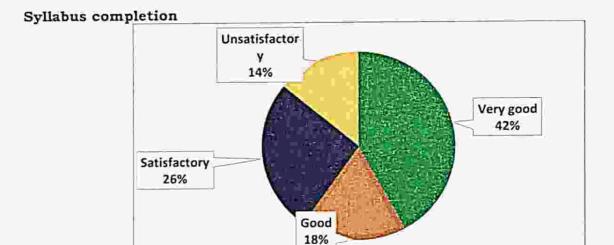


Figure 1 reveals that 74% of students agreed (with 47% strongly agreeing) that the teacher covered the entire university-mandated syllabus.

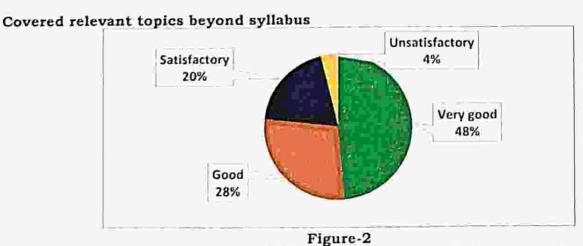


Figure 2 shows that 70% of pupils agreed (43% strongly agreed) that the teacher covered important topics outside of the curriculum.

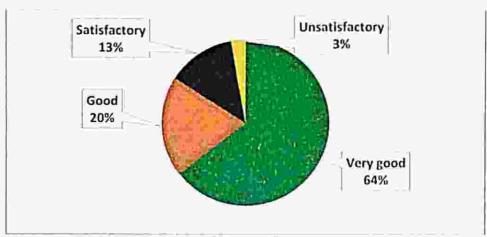

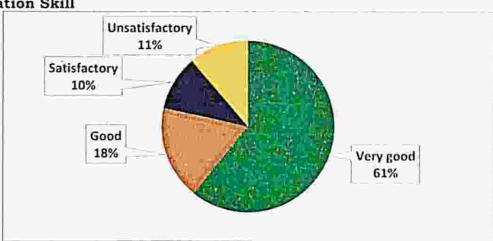

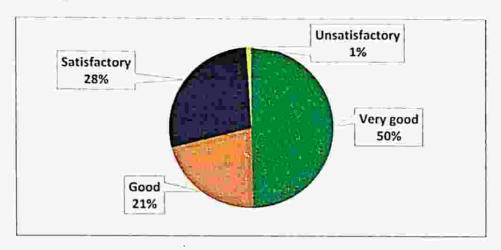

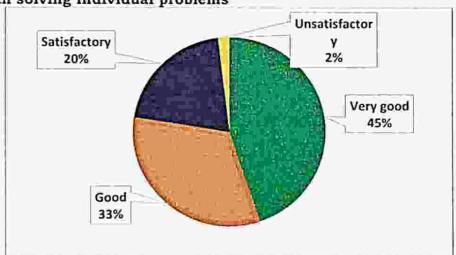

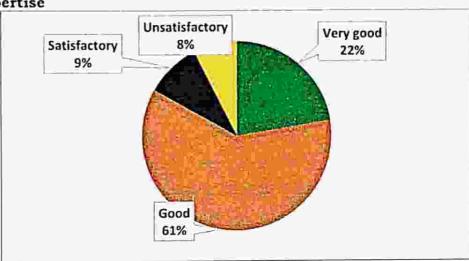

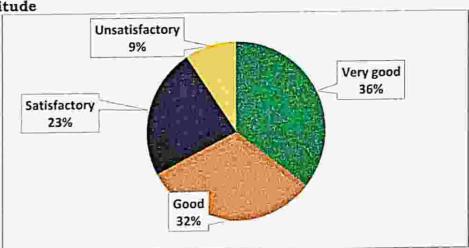

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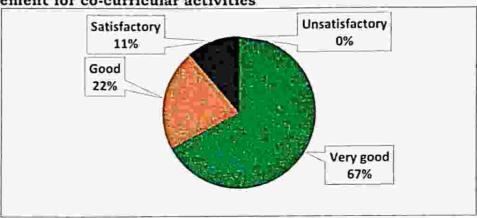

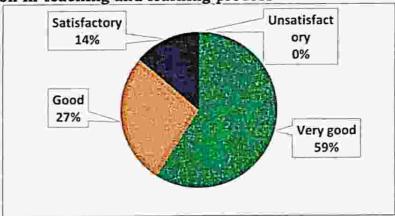

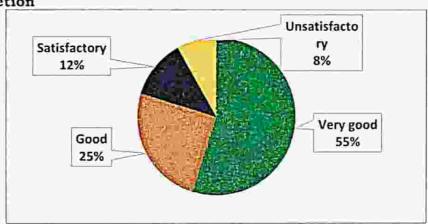

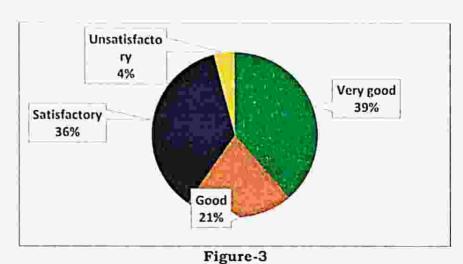


Figure 3 reveals that 64% of students agreed (and 44% strongly agreed) that teachers use the ICT in the classroom.

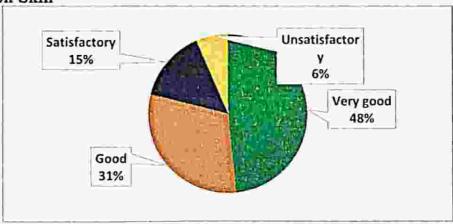

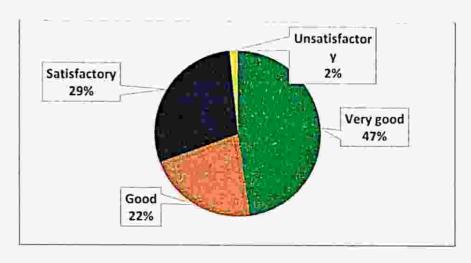

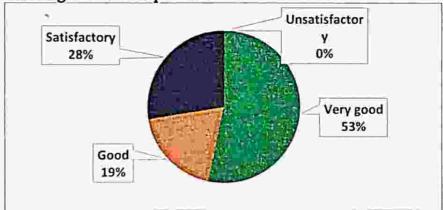

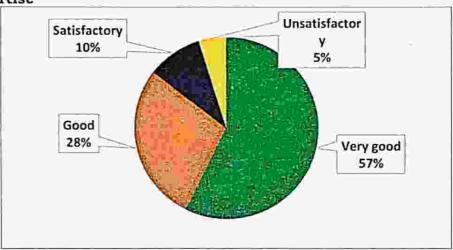

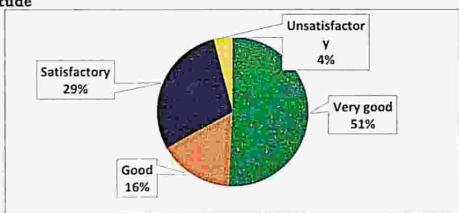

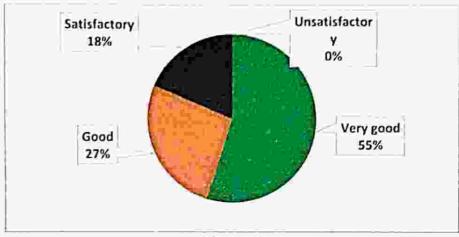

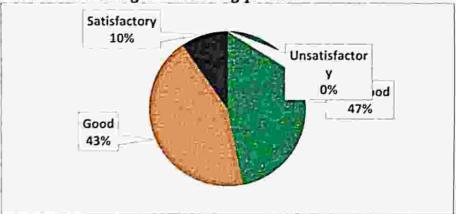

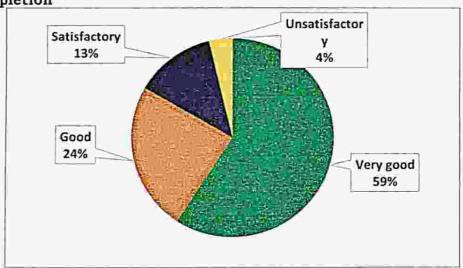


Figure 1 reveals that 74% of students agreed (with 47% strongly agreeing) that the teacher covered the entire university-mandated syllabus.

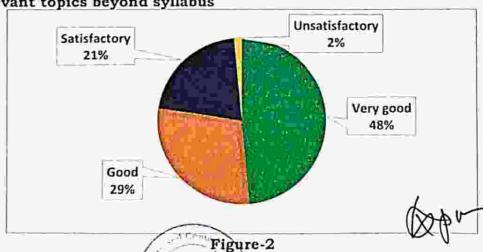


Figure 2 shows that 76% of pupils agreed (48%) strongly agreed) that the teacher covered important topics outside of the curriculum.

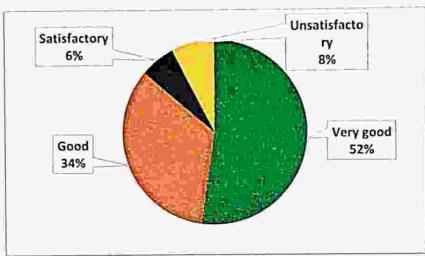

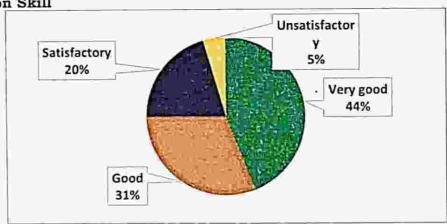

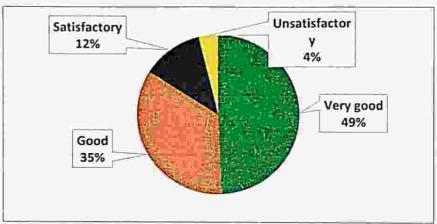

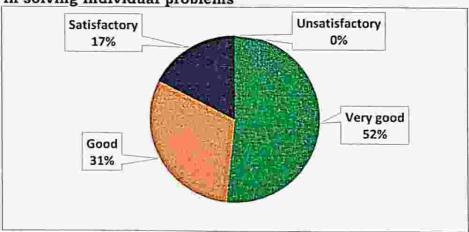

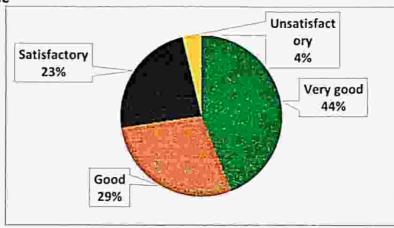

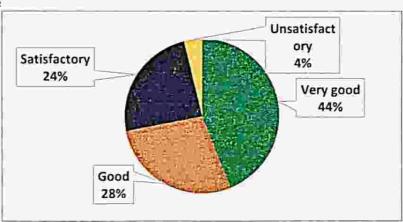

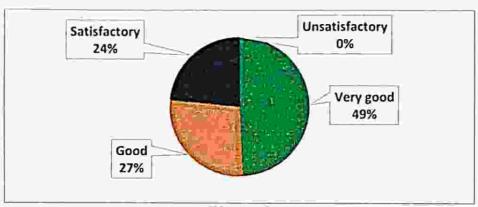

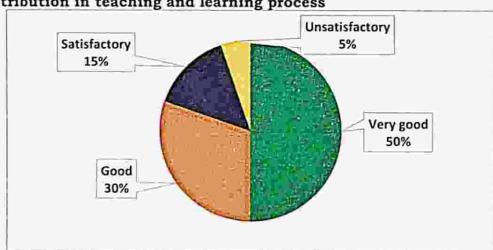

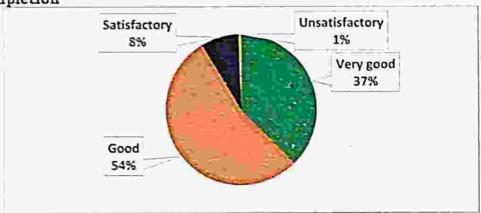

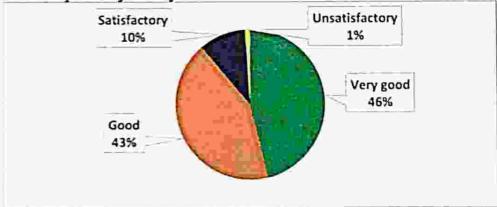

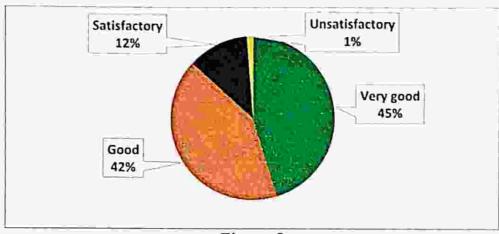

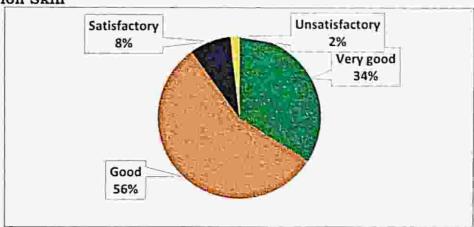

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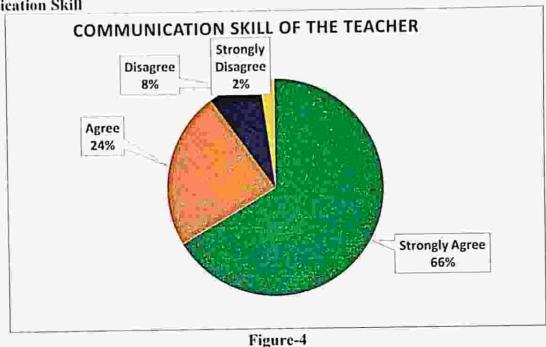


Figure 4 indicates that 90% think the teacher's communication skills are good (66% definitely agree).

Figure 4 indicates that 68 % think the teacher's communication skills are good (51) percent definitely agree).



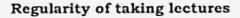

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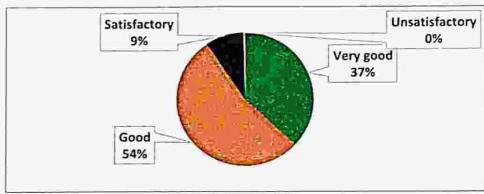

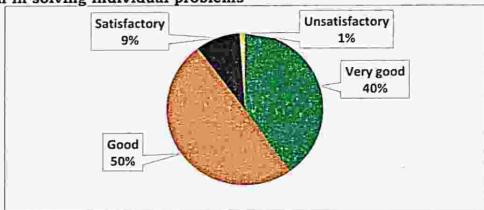

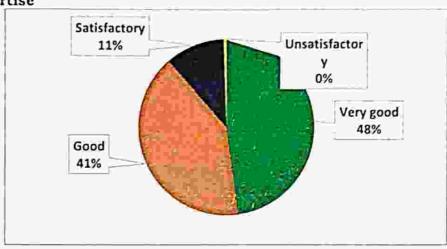

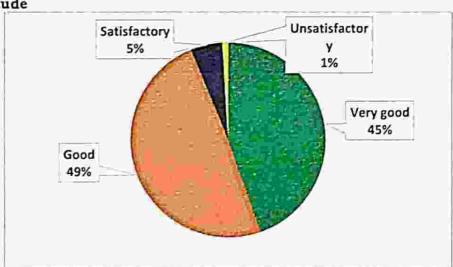

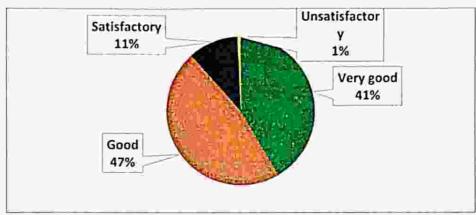

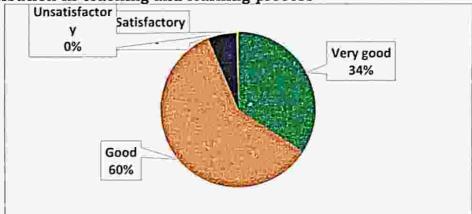

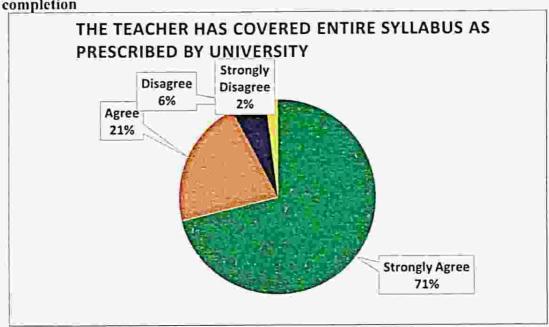

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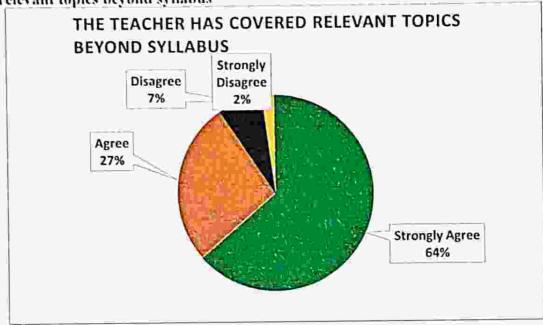


Figure-2 Figure 2 shows that 91% of pupils agreed (64% strongly agreed) that the teacher covered important topics outside of the curriculum.



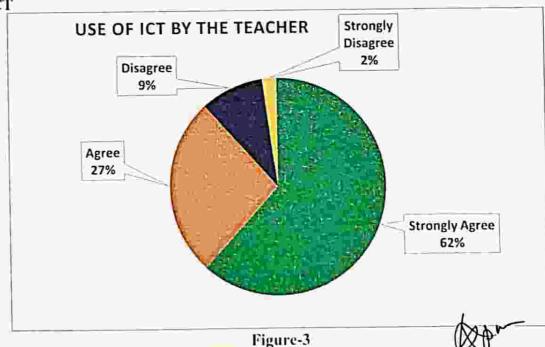


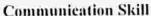

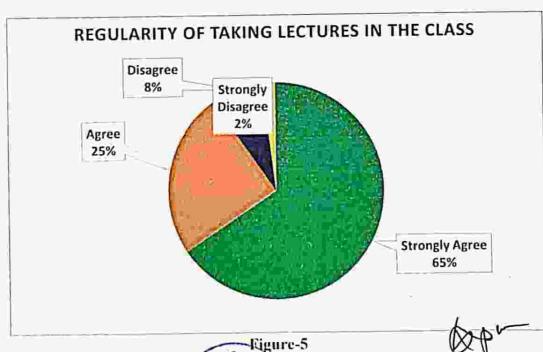

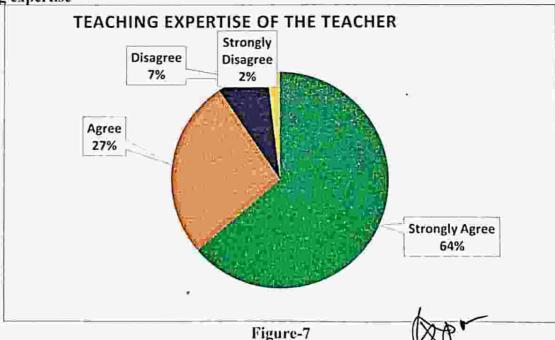

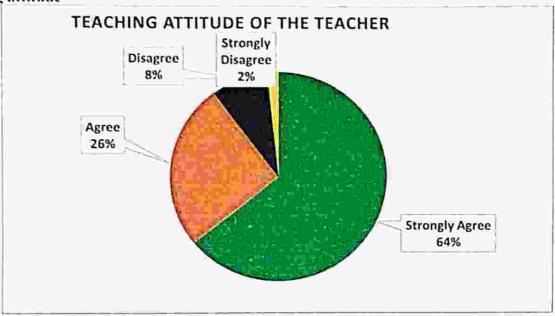

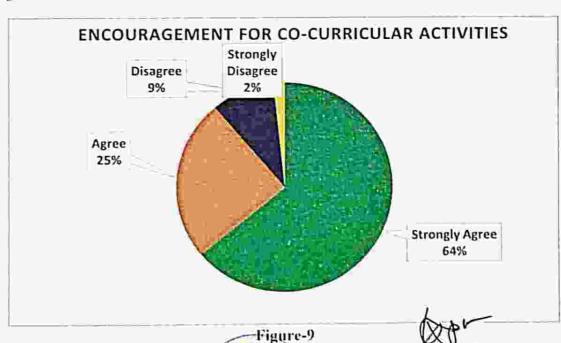


Figure 9 demonstrates that 89% of students agreed (with 64% strongly agreeing) that teachers encourage students to participate in co-curricular activities.

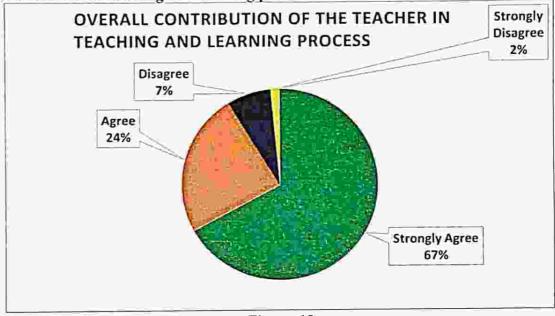

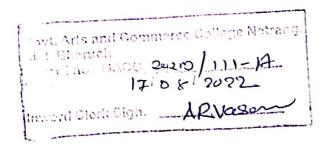

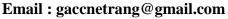
